



REGISTRATION & COUNSELING PROCESS

- Candidates are informed that e-mail Address and Mobile Number submitted by candidate in the Online Application Form of NTA is used for registration on the MCC portal for Counselling.
- All the information/ communication will be sent by MCC of DGHS, MoHFW through email on the registered e-mail address or SMS on registered Mobile Number only.
- Any complaint with regard to the change of registered mobile number or email address shall not be entertained by the MCC of DGHS, MoHFW.
- Candidates are advised to use Laptop or Computer along with the latest registered version of Chrome/Internet Explorer/Firefox/Windows/IOS during the Registration and Choice-Filling process to avoid any technical complications.
- Qualified and eligible candidates are required to register on the MCC website i.e. www.mcc.nic.in to participate in the counselling process for allotment of seat. MCC does not allot any seat either on nomination basis or manually.
- Candidates are advised to download sandes app for OTP on your registered phone number for registration.

Documents Required for NEET Counselling: Overview of the NEET UG Counseling Process

NEET UG Exam

The National Testing Agency (NTA) administers the NEET UG, a nationwide admission test. In India, it serves as the main entrance examination for undergraduate programs in dentistry (BDS) and medicine (MBBS).

Registration for NEET 2023 Counseling

Documents required for NEET counselling, the NEET counseling process begins. The following are the steps:

- Candidates must log in and choose "Candidate login" on the MCC website.
- Next, input the password and roll number.
- Candidates must now provide their Name, Roll Number, Registration Number, Mother's Name, and Contact information once the page has been forwarded to a new page.
- 'Submit' should be clicked.

Fee Payment for NEET 2022 Counseling

The applicants can move on with paying their fees once they have successfully enrolled and have the necessary Documents required for NEET counselling. Consequently, the specific charge for each institution is as follows:

Results Announcement

The NTA announces the NEET results following the Documents required for NEET counselling, often within a month. Candidates can view their scores and rankings on the official website, where the results are usually posted.

Merit list

An All India Merit List and State Merit Lists are usually created based on the NEET UG results. The candidate's rank is usually determined by the merit lists, which are normally based on the candidate's NEET score.

Registration and Choice Filling

Candidates who satisfy the requirements for NEET UG must register for counseling.

Depending on their rank and category, they must fill out a list of the colleges and courses they choose.

Document Verification

Candidates must appear at the authorized counseling facilities for Documents required for NEET counselling after selecting their options. They must have their original paperwork on hand for verification, including mark sheets, NEET UG scorecards, identity documents, etc.

Seat Allocation

When allocating seats in colleges, the counseling authority takes into account the merit rank, the choices made by the candidates, and the availability of seats. The method for allocating seats is usually centralized online.

Reporting to provided College
